## If Ataxia Specialist Nurses are the answer...... What's the problem?

- 49% 12+ months after GP visit to be seen by a neurologist (NNPE)
- 42% additional 12 months to be diagnosed. (NNPE)
- 28% completely understood the diagnosis explanation given at the time (NNPE).
- 74% felt lack of knowledge from GPs and primary care professionals. (AUK2021)
- 35% felt lack of knowledge from consultants or neurologists (AUK2020)






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
- 43% lack of information about ataxia and symptoms (AUK2021)
- 38% lack of practical support (AUK2020)
- 44% lack of emotional support. (AUK2020)
- 68% not asked re mental wellbeing by health/social care professional (NNPE).
- 28% had access to speech therapy which met most needs. (AUK2020)

## How will it work?

- Nurse supports patient in attending clinical appointments:
  - Preparation
  - Accompany
  - Debrief
- Nurse establishes legitimacy with neurologist
- Nurse invited into clinics by neurologists to support them
- Nurse supported by clinical and managerial supervision

# Benefits for people with ataxia

#### Holistic service

- Information and explanation
- Support in attending neurology appointments
- Support in accessing joined up services
- [Once in clinic] support from the moment of diagnosis

# Benefits for local neurologists

- Nurse expertise in ataxia and educational role
- Nurse links to expert neurologists to foster networking and advice to local neurologists
- Nurse as conduit for information on new developments

### What can Specialist Nurses Bring?

- Knowledge of, and insight into, the patient pathway/services available
- High-level expertise in the care of a specific patient group.
- Additional qualifications meaning they can perform advanced tasks.
- Nurse potential to find/engage people for trials/research
- Knowledge of the patient organisation, partner organisations and other resources

### Issues to be resolved

- Relationship between the nurse and NHS services
  - Exchange of information and GDPR issues
  - Protocols
- Size of caseload
- Selection of patients
